

Dear friends, as I've shared with you over the past two years, it is not popular at times to discuss difficult teachings of the Church. But it is a preacher's duty to speak the truth and to die for it.

From the Pastor From the life of Saint John of Sahagun, O.S.A. by John of Seville –

While blessed John was serving in the curia of the bishop of Burgos he devoted himself wholly to divine worship and gave such satisfaction to the bishop that the latter conferred various benefices on him. John however, sought from that most reverend prelate, permission to withdraw to some lonely place where he might serve God more fittingly. The bishop assumed that a petition of this kind must mean that what he had so far conferred fell short of John's ambitions, but John assured him: "That is not my motive, nor is my intention what you suppose. On the contrary, I beseech your Lordship rather to consider to whom you can with a clear conscience transfer those benefices conferred on me, for I am certain that I cannot keep them."

Later he entered upon the state of perfection in our most holy Order, and if I were to be asked how he bore himself afterwards towards the unhappy and afflicted, towards widows and orphans suffering oppression, towards all in need of assistance and sick people, I should reply that he was habitually moved by a kind of natural impulse to help everyone, sometimes with good advice and sometimes with alms collected for the purpose. Moreover he took pains to bring all men to peace and concord by calming feuds and quarrels. By this means he was able while living at Salamanca to prevent many murders, the whole city being at that time rent by civil strife.

Very great crowds attended his sermons, lured as though by so powerful an attraction that on all sides people would say, "We are going to hear our favorite preacher." Nevertheless, he was fearless in discharging this duty, and never sparing with the truth, though he knew the right place and time for speaking it.

In all honesty I declare what was testified to me: he vehemently rebuked the aristocracy for their slothfulness in their households, the swindlers who withheld the goods of others, their accomplices and the patrons of evildoers, as well as those who ill-treated their subordinates, the rioters and the leaders of factions. So stern was his castigation that no one could doubt that almighty God spoke through his mouth for the correction of the high nobility there present.

This freedom of speech gravely upset the Duke of Alba who summoned John to his residence. Among other things the bystanders heard the Duke say, "It looks as though you do not know how to bridle your tongue, Father." The saint, who had until now been silent, answered, "For what purpose do I ascend the pulpit, Sir? Is it to proclaim the truth to my hearers, or to wheedle them by base flattery? It is becoming for Your Grace to know that a preacher must be prepared in his soul to speak the truth, both in denouncing and correcting shortcomings and in praising virtue to such a point that he is willing in that cause even to face death."

In the cause of truth he was indeed exposed to danger in this way not only from the Duke of Alba, but also from many among both the nobility and the common people. We have no doubt in fact we are certain, that his death was due to his being poisoned by a certain unchaste woman. Let it also be known to Your Grace that it was John's custom to offer Mass daily, nor did he ever omit it unless unavoidably hindered. But he took so long over offering the most holy Sacrifice that eventually he could find no one willing to serve his Mass. However, he was in the habit of going to confession to the Prior, and to him he explained his difficulty. In view of the situation the Prior then gave orders to his subjects that they were to comply with John's wishes about the manner of his saying Mass, and were in no way to interfere with him.

The living kindness of God revealed itself to him in the Sacrament. He used to see Christ, who showed himself to his servant in this divine mystery in a form visible to bodily eyes and in such a way that John could speak to him. The Prior, Father Martin de Spinoza, made a formal statement to me in these words: "Father John, I declare to Your Reverence that when he acknowledged to me how many mysteries he had understood while offering the holy Sacrifice, I was seized with sacred awe and rapt from my senses, until it seemed to me that I was about to fall dead to the ground."

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)


Did you miss your opportunity with last year's RCIA group? Are you interested in learning more about the Catholic faith? Now is the time to think about becoming Catholic.


