During his address to the U.S. Congress, in his recent visit to the Untied States, Pope Trom the Pastor four persons were Abraham Lincoln, Martin Luther King Jr., Dorothy Day, and Thomas Merton. The pope held them up as examples of Americans who through hard work and sacrifice, and some even at the cost of their lives, worked towards a better future.

We Americans are proud when we say that America is a place where individuals can, through hard work and sacrifice, build a better future for ourselves and our children. But so often when we hear that, we think of career and education. The Pope is challenging all of us, to rediscover our greatest American value; to be united as one nation, working to build a better society, with "Justice and liberty for all". These four Americans represent examples of men and women of different ethnicity, race, religious beliefs, and economic status, but who were not afraid to stand for Gospel values and challenge sinful structures.

Dorothy Day and Thomas Merton were Catholics, and perhaps less familiar to us than Martin Luther King Jr., and Abraham Lincoln. Fr. Tom asked me two write a little bit about each these two Catholic figures.

Today I will write a bit about Dorothy Day and in a coming week, about Thomas Merton. Dorothy Day was born in 1897 in New York, attended the University of Illinois Urbana, and after college worked as a journalist in New York, for publications considered radical, challenging various aspects of American society. She had a reputation of living a less than admirable life, including drunkenness, living with a man outside of marriage, and having an abortion. But after the birth of her first child, began to feel God calling her to conversion. She became Catholic in 1927 and dedicated her life to God's service. She credited God for her meeting with Peter Maurin, a French intellectual and Catholic, who convinced Day that social reform and Catholic faith could be united, and together they founded the Catholic Worker Movement. Dorothy and Peter sought not only to help the poor materially, but saw the exclusion of the poor, and powerless, within our society as the greater injustice. They sought to build community by living with the poor, creating community though hospitality houses, and addressing issues that divide us. The Catholic Worker Movement still continues today, and invites members to live simply, in community, serving the poor, and resisting war and social injustice. Community life is centered on the Gospel, prayer, and the Catholic faith. There are 208 Catholic Worker Communities in the United States, 28 outside the United States, and 24 in California.

In 2000, when Cardinal John O'Connor of New York, the archbishop of her native city, proposed her for sainthood, he felt compelled to address her choice to have an abortion early in her life. He wrote that "She regretted it every day of her life" and added that her conversion showed God's mercy and the possibility of turning from "The ultimate act of violence against innocent life in the womb, to a position of total holiness and pacifism." Dorothy Day is currently referred to by the Church as a "Servant of God", which is a title for someone in the first stages of being considered for canonization as a Saint in the Catholic Church.

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he had sat down, his disciples came to him. He began to teach them, saying: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven. Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land. Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."
