


**Entering the Year of Mercy**

From the Pastor

Pope Francis opened the Year of Mercy in a war zone last Sunday at the Bangui Cathedral in the Central African Republic. Pope Francis at a prayer vigil said: "The Jubilee Year of Mercy, which I just opened particularly for you, dear Central African and African friends, rightly reminds us that God is waiting for us, with arms wide open, as we see the beautiful image of the Father who welcomes the Prodigal Son". How do we love in a war zone? We turn to our Merciful and Loving God and ask for mercy. Have Mercy on us Lord! Receiving God's Mercy we are changed and transformation begins as we learn to Love how God loves. St. Maximilian Kolbe speaks of this transformation: "Finally, love for one's neighbor. Loving our neighbor, not because he is "nice," worthwhile, wealthy, influential, or just because he is grateful....

Genuine love rises above the creature and plunges into God. In Him, for Him and through Him we can love everyone, be they good or bad, friends or foes. We can offer a helping hand, full of love to everyone; we can pray for all, suffer for all, wish good to all, wish happiness to all, because that is God's will!..." St. Maximilian Kolbe

**St. Faustina and the Divine Mercy**

Sister Faustina was a young, uneducated nun in a convent of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Poland during the 1930s. She came from a poor family that struggled during the years of World War I. She had only three years of simple education, so hers were the humblest tasks in the convent, usually in the kitchen or garden. However, she received extraordinary revelations – or messages – from our Lord Jesus. Jesus asked Sr. Faustina to record these experiences, which she compiled into notebooks. These notebooks are known today as the *Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska*, and the words contained within are God's loving message of Divine Mercy.

Though the Divine Mercy message is not new to the teachings of the Church, Sr. Faustina's Diary sparked a great movement, and a strong and significant focus on the mercy of Christ. Saint John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina in 2000 making her the "first saint of the new millennium." Speaking of Sr. Faustina and the importance of the message contained in her Diary, the Pope called her "the great apostle of Divine Mercy in our time." **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (Patroness of the United States)**

**The Jubilee Year of Mercy begins December 8 at 8:30AM and 7PM**

Why is the Immaculate Conception important? As I ponder the teaching I am brought to the mystery of incarnation, that God became human in Jesus Christ. We know that Mary is the Mother of Jesus and the Mother of God, *theotokos* the one who bears Christ. Since God is without sin, a pure sinless person must give Jesus his humanity. Mary was given a singular grace of being Immaculately Conceived so she could respond without the corruption of sin to be the Mother of God. In the Immaculate

Conception, God's plan to break into human history to love us and save fallen humanity. Our Merciful God breaks into human history to save us. Mary in the immaculate Conception is the New Eve that is free to say yes to God and respond to the invitation of God to be God's Children. The curse of sin and death is broken as humanity through the Immaculate Virgin Mary is brought into relationship with Trinitarian Love as She is Daughter of the creator, Mother of Christ, and Spouse of the Holy Spirit.

The Apostolic Constitution «Ineffabilis Deus», published on 8th December 1854, by Blessed Pope Pius IX, echoes in a remarkable way Scotus' own theology regarding the privilege of the Immaculate Conception in the following solemn proclamation of this Dogma of Catholic faith: "we pronounce and we define the doctrine which holds that the most Blessed Virgin Mary, in the very first moments of her Conception, through the singular grace of Almighty God, and through the foresight of the merits of Christ Jesus, Savior of the human race, was preserved immune from all stains of original sin."

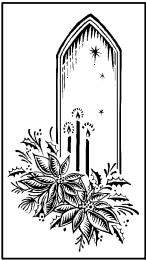


### THE SOLEMNITY OF THE FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

**Gospel for THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT  
(December 13th)**

**Luke 3:10-18**

The crowds asked John the Baptist, "What should we do?" He said to them in reply, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized and they said to him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He answered them, "Stop collecting more than what is prescribed." Soldiers also asked him, "And what is it that we should do?" He told them, "Do not practice extortion, do not falsely accuse anyone, and be satisfied with your wages."

Now the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." Exhorting them in many other ways, he preached good news to the people.

**Saturday, January 30, 2016**

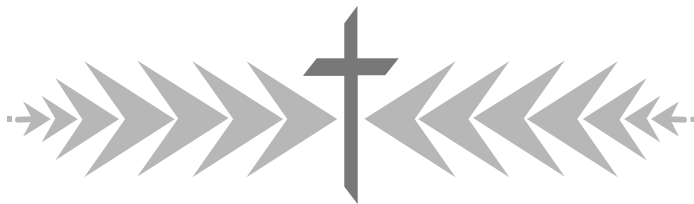
