Luke 13:1-9

Pietas (*Responding from your heart to the Love of God*).

From the Pastor Pietas is the latin word meaning (compassion, dutifulness, kindness.) This is the root word for piety. In art the most famous sculpture is the "Pieta" statue of Mary cradling the

dead body of Jesus after the Crucifixion at St. Peter's Basilica. St. Francis encouraged the Franciscan friars to develop hearts of devotion in prayer. St. Francis gave St. Anthony permission to teach the friars theology as long as his teaching did not extinguish prayer and devotion of the friars. In this Year of Mercy I have been focusing on building and expressing pietas in our hearts and actions. I introduced our community to St. Maximilian Kolbe and the M. I. movement that he started. The mission of the Militia Immaculata is to bring every person through Mary to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. St. Maximilian Kolbe gave us a method of keeping our heart in the right place in the face of evil and opposition. Building a civilization of Love takes vision and heart. Through daily consecration to the Imaculata we enter Mary's Mission to bring Christ to all humanity. Her "yes" is the human response to the invitation of God to a relationship of love. St. Maximilian Kolbe gave an example of the fruit of this consecration by being a messenger of love in the dehumanizing hell that was Auschwitz. He loved the oppressed and the oppressor since Christ came for all. Divine love is totally self giving in Jesus. Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta was a member of the M.I. and as she served the poorest of the poor she showed us the beauty of ever human being. No one is untouchable, all are loved by God. Mother Teresa showed us the way of compassion. She freely gave of herself and gave Miraculous Medals, as the consecration was the conduit of grace which empowered her to live Divine Love.

The Message of St. Faustina is an invitation to Divine Mercy. God is love and when we encounter that love when we are in sin or alienated by God we receive Mercy. In the Play of Faustina we are drawn over and over to Jesus in his Passion where we see the profound love of God for us and the depth of his mission to save us. The image of the Divine Mercy is a Resurrected Jesus who reveals it is from his Heart that the Sacraments Flow to us. The red rays bring us to his Passion and Love and the white rays to the waters of Baptism. The purpose of the Divine Mercy Chaplet is to enter into the Divine Mercy of the Passion and pray for those who are most in need especially the souls in purgatory.

Gospel for the Thirst Sunday in Lent (February 28th)

Some people told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with the blood of their sacrifices. Jesus said to them in reply, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were greater sinners than all other Galileans? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did! Or those eighteen people who were killed when the tower at Siloam fell on them— do you think they were more guilty than everyone else who lived in Jerusalem? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did!" And he told them this parable: "There once was a person who had a fig tree planted in his orchard, and when he came in search of fruit on it but found none, he said to the gardener, 'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?' He said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not you can cut it down.""

DO NOT BE AFRAID OF CONFESSION


