**Friday, March 4 - 24 Hours of Mercy (We need your help!)**

*From the Pastor* The School Children will begin our day of prayer with the Stations of the Cross at 2:30pm. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament begins at 3pm and will continue for 24 hours. Bring your family for an hour or two of prayer in the presence of the Lord. Confession will be offered from 3pm until 4pm and from 7pm until 9pm on Friday and 9:30 am until 10:30am in Spanish and English on Saturday. Songs of Mercy will be provided by our Choirs from 7pm until 9pm. The Rosary will be prayed on Friday evening at 4,5,9,and 10pm. On Saturday the Rosary will be at 9am in Spanish and at 10, 11, and Noon in English. The Divine Mercy Chaplet will be prayed at 3pm on both days. There will be a Bilingual Mass on Saturday at 8:30am. Keep Vigil with the Lord at Adoration with the Men of Faith from 10pm until 7am. Please sign up for an hour through the night this Weekend or call the office.

**PILGRIMAGE**

**Gospel for the Fourth Sunday in Lent (March 6th)****John 9:1, 6-9, 13-17, 34-38**

As Jesus passed by he saw a man blind from birth. He spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes, and said to him, “Go wash in the Pool of Siloam” — which means Sent —. So he went and washed, and came back able to see. His neighbors and those who had seen him earlier as a beggar said, “Isn’t this the one who used to sit and beg?” Some said, “It is,” but others said, “No, he just looks like him.” He said, “I am.” They brought the one who was once blind to the Pharisees. Now Jesus had made clay and opened his eyes on a sabbath. So then the Pharisees also asked him how he was able to see. He said to them, “He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see.” So some of the Pharisees said, “This man is not from God, because he does not keep the sabbath.” But others said, “How can a sinful man do such signs?” And there was a division among them. So they said to the blind man again, “What do you have to say about him, since he opened your eyes?” He said, “He is a prophet.” They answered and said to him, “You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?” Then they threw him out. When Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, he found him and said, “Do you believe in the Son of Man?” He answered and said, “Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?” Jesus said to him, “You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he.” He said, “I do believe, Lord,” and he worshiped him.

**“Sharing God’s Mercy” –  
The Bishop’s Annual Appeal**

Throughout the Diocese last weekend was Bishop’s Appeal Commitment Weekend.

It is important that we as a parish support the work and ministry of the Office of the Bishop. For many years Our Lady of Grace parishioners have supported the Bishop’s Appeal as it provides the means to continue the mission Christ has entrusted to us: to serve, to educate, to care for the poor, and to be a beacon of hope. The ministries, services and programs that are funded from this effort allow us to fulfill the mission given to us all. More specifics about the areas supported by your generosity can be found in the brochures on the table in the vestibule.

Here at Our Lady of Grace we have over 1000 registered households. Last year 112 households participated in the Diocesan Capital Campaign: Reclaiming Christ. We are grateful to those individuals and families who made that commitment and who continue to honor their pledges to that four year campaign.

As a parish we have consistently achieved our Bishops Appeal goals largely due to the efforts of less than 200 individuals and households. We are confident that once again we will achieve our goal. We have been asked by the Diocese to form a committee and make presentations on the appeal and to hold a commitment weekend. However, given our past record I am confident we will once again make our goal without all of those steps. The challenge this year is to encourage all those families and individuals who did not participate in the previous campaign to make the commitment to this year’s Bishops Appeal. If those roughly 880 households participated in the Bishops Appeal we would have our goal achieved in no time.

If you have not yet completed a Bishop’s Appeal pledge envelope, they can be found in the pews. I ask you to please complete an envelope and drop it in any collection. Our parish goal is \$25,139.54. This is the same goal as we had in 2014, and in 2014 we reached 107% of that goal. I am confident we can do so again. As always, I thank you for your usual generosity. Please make the commitment to be part of this solution.
