

Palm (Passion) Sunday and Holy Week

From the Pastor

During Holy Week we are entering more deeply into the Mystery of Christ's Passion. Only on Passion Sunday and Good Friday do we proclaim the Passion Gospels. We enter into the Three Days (Triduum) beginning with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. We continue our prayer on Good Friday with the proclamation of the Passion and Veneration of the Cross. We culminate our Prayer at the Easter Vigil where we remember God reaching out to humanity throughout history until alienation of death is conquered in the Resurrection. We initiate those who have prepared over the last year for this moment when they profess their faith and join us as brothers and sisters in Christ receiving Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. This is the Night! **Join us on Easter Morning** to celebrate the Resurrection with the disciples as they come to the empty tomb and hear He has Risen. Invite your friends and family to come encounter our Risen Lord with the community of the faithful founded by Christ through St. Peter and the Apostles. For 2000 years the Catholic Church has invited people to come join us, to hear the message of Jesus Christ, enter into the mystery of His Passion, Death, and Resurrection where we are saved, so we may come to Communion with God who loves us.

Fasting and Abstinence are obligatory on Good Friday.

Who has to fast? People who are 18-59 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. A proper fast means only one full meal is eaten that day. Snacks can be consumed in the morning, afternoon or evening. The snacks are dependent on when the full meal is eaten. It can be had at any time. Who cannot eat meat? Catholics age 14 and older should abstain from meat on Ash Wednesdays and all the Fridays during Lent, especially **Good Friday**, which is the last one before Easter.

Paschal Fast

A spiritual practice preparing for Easter is partaking in the Paschal Fast. I have practiced this for many years and have found it to be a way of entering more deeply into the Mystery of our Salvation. I have offered this sacrifice for those who are being initiated into the faith and to be in solidarity with those being persecuted for their faith. This fast begins after the mass of Holy Thursday until after the Easter vigil on Saturday night.

Divine Mercy Novena

Divine Mercy Novena begins On Good Friday. Prayer pamphlets are in the middle of the Church. In her Diary, Jesus told Sr. Faustina, **"I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that from there they may draw strength and refreshment and whatever grace they need in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death"** (Diary, 1209). While the Chaplet can be said anytime, the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena, promising that **"By this Novena (of Chaplets), I will grant every possible grace to souls"** (Diary 796).

Gospel for Easter Sunday (March 27th)

John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.






