

"STATE OF THE PARISH"



From the Pastor

In 2015, the parish said goodbye to the Augustinians after 35 years of service at Our Lady of Grace and welcomed the Conventual Franciscans to begin spiritual care of the parish. The Augustinians left the parish financially sound and spiritually engaged. The Conventual Franciscans have charted a new course by sharing their spirituality, saints, and devotions. The image and devotion to Our Lady of Grace has been influential in our Marian Spirituality as friars and it has been a blessing to serve at a church in her honor. I continue to be grateful for all the support and positive feedback from all our parishioners. We as the Franciscans have felt embraced by your welcome and are blessed to be here. I offer the following summary of the State of the Parish. We currently have 980 registered households. Mass attendance in 2015 averaged 785 which was an increase over 2014. In October, we added a weekly Spanish Mass expanding on the monthly mass introduced by Fr. Greg. We have seen the attendance double at that Mass and it continues to grow as it becomes known. In this Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy we have explored the Mercy of Christ through Pilgrimage, Consecration to Mary, by praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet and reflecting on Divine Mercy by offering the play Faustina to the community, and by offering the sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick more regularly. We will continue to have events during this Year of Mercy to welcome people home to Our Lady of Grace to encounter our merciful God.

During 2015 we improved our physical plant by adding the security gate at Somerset offering greater security for our school students as well as the property. Our Church roof was replaced at the cost of \$50,000. The gutters on just about every building on the property were replaced or repaired and repairs were made in Casa Villanova as well as the carport and fence surrounding the Casa. We also added or replaced lighting in and around several buildings to more cost efficient fixtures. We repurposed the old school office in Stack Center to a small conference room by adding laminate flooring, paint and new furniture. Even with all these improvements and an increased cost of doing business, we ended the year in the black. The generosity and faithful stewardship of our parishioners made all this possible. We received \$132,000 in bequests last year. We also received \$22,000 in directed donations to the new security gate. The monthly donations to the maintenance fund last year totaled \$28,900 allowing for some of the above mentioned property improvements. Our plate collection grew by 4% over 2014. We had successful and well attended fundraisers with our annual Fall Festival and Spring Auction that benefited both the school and parish. As a tithing parish, in response to the Gospel call we gave 10% of the net proceeds from the Festival and Spring Auction to assist those organizations and groups who serve those most in need in our local and greater community.

We have been blessed with new life as we baptized 35, had 60 First Communions, and 31 were received in Confirmation. We continue to have new parishioners join our community and are blessed in 2016 as many of our School families have joined the parish.

We thank all of you who participated in the Diocesan Capital Campaign last year and through your generosity the diocese raised \$248, 368 from Our Lady of Grace members achieving 48% of our goal. As your pledges are completed we will receive over \$60,000 returned to the parish for directed funds to repair the parking lot as well as make improvements to Stack Center and the Church. If you are not participating in the financial life of the parish we ask you to consider your commitment to the parish.

WELCOMING REFUGEES AT OLG

In January, Bishop Michael Barber asked, "Wouldn't it be great if we became the first diocese in the USA where every parish co-sponsored a refugee family with Catholic Charities?" In March, several of your fellow parishioners met and asked, "Wouldn't it be great if we could be one of the parishes to respond to Pope Francis' call for service?" Answer: We hope to be!

This weekend we heard more about this proposal at the Masses. There will also be an important planning meeting on Wednesday, **May 18th** at 7:00pm in Stack Center at which you can get answers to your questions and find out the ways you can participate.

There will be opportunities to provide a warm welcome at the airport, collect household goods and furnishings, stock the pantry, and/or connect refugees to available services. It is important to remember that we will be working in partnership with the Catholic Charities East Bay's Refugee Resettlement Program, rather than taking on this challenge on our own. It is also our hope that we will be working in partnership with a sizeable group of committed parishioners so that the work of providing support to the newly arrived refugee family will be a shared responsibility and a joy to perform. We look forward to seeing you at the meeting **May 18th**.

In 2016 let us challenge ourselves spiritually to spread the Gospel by:

1. Inviting people to join our community of faith so we may share our faith with joy. Our goal is 50 new families or a 5% increase in participating families
2. Providing a more robust engagement of our families in both our school and parish creating new opportunities to encounter grace and hope here at Our Lady of Grace especially for this and future generations.
3. Renewing ourselves and our ministries as we embrace the New Evangelization to draw people to Christ through a personal and profound encounter with Jesus in love and joy.

Financially I ask us to embrace and fund this mission :

- By giving 5% more and having all our families participate financially to take ownership of our church.
- Less than 20% of our families participate in our regular giving program. I would ask that we all give something and that we double the participation of the families participating in our regular giving program.
- Support our fundraising events especially our Fall Festival and our Spring Auction.

With a greater financial support we can expand ministry, especially youth ministry to engage another generation for Christ finding hope and purpose in a world that that is hurting and violent. We would like to expand our office hours to be present to our community. We would like to upgrade church lighting, and upgrade Stack Center and Office area which is looking worn.

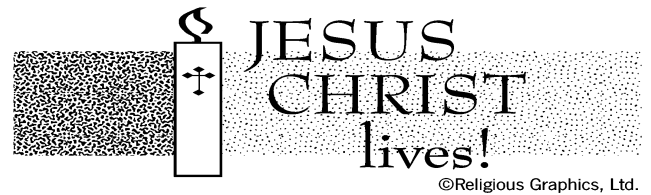

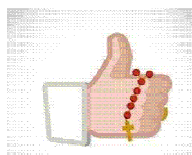
