## Thursday Holy Hour beginning in September

"Holy Hour" is a form of Eucharistic adoration made in response to a revelation by Christ to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690), as a part of our devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The focus of Holy Hour is Christ in the Garden of Gethsemane. In response to His question, "Could you not watch one hour?" (Mark 14:37), we respond, "Yes, Lord, we are here with Thee." Pope Pius XI, in Miserentissimus Redemptor (1928), writes of these reparative acts of consolation to the Sacred Heart. I ask that we as a parish come spend an hour before the Lord praying that each of us and especially our youth may be touched by His Sacred Heart and know the Love and Friendship of Jesus. May we ask the Holy Spirit to prepare us to receive this generation and share our love of Jesus so they may come to know Jesus and love Him. Come and Pray!

# GOSPEL FOR 23RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (SEPTEMBER 4TH)

### LUKE 14:25-33

Great crowds were traveling with Jesus, and he turned and addressed them, "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost to see if there is enough for its completion? Otherwise, after laying the foundation and finding himself unable to finish the work the onlookers should laugh at him and say, 'This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish.' Or what king marching into battle would not first sit down and decide whether with ten thousand troops he can successfully oppose another king advancing upon him with twenty thousand troops? But if not, while he is still far away, he will send a delegation to ask for peace terms. In the same way, anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple."


