Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I am inspired by the way that Pope Francis has captured the attention of the world with his provocative and prophetic witness to Christ. He is challenging to all people but he is especially challenging to us who already believe in Jesus. He wrote at the very beginning of his pontificate in The Joy of the Gospel: "I invite all Christians everywhere, at this very moment, to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ." For many years now, throughout the world, God has used the Alpha Course to help millions of people, both those young in faith and those mature in faith, to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ.

- Every Catholic needs to experience and constantly renew a deep personal encounter with Jesus Christ. We gather weekly to *renew ourselves* in our relation with Jesus through Communion however we need reflect on our faith and relationship with Jesus since it is an everlasting dynamic encounter.
- Every Catholic needs to understand how vital it is to share the best thing that ever happened to us with those to whom God is sending us, and to be equipped to do so sensitively. We have a Mission to share the Joy.
- We cannot do this on our own. We must do this *together*. Catholic means universal and together we live and share our faith.

The Alpha Course is the best way I know to accomplish these three things. And this is not just my personal opinion. As you have seen over the summer in the bulletin, it is the experience of many of the most trusted and influential leaders in the Catholic Church.

As we get closer to the October Alpha Youth launch you will continue to hear more about Alpha. There will be updates through out the Fall as we experience Alpha with the Youth and prepare for Adult Alpha beginning in Advent. I ask that we at Our Lady of Grace do 3 things:

Pray Spend time in quiet prayer asking God to prepare us to receive people and to be able to share our faith. I have begun a *Holy Hour* on Thursday Nights from 7Pm to 8PM.

Invite Please pray that the Lord will direct us on who to encounter to invite. Our High School Youth for the Youth Series Beginning in October and for the Adult Series Beginning in Advent. Post cards will be available to share and invite others.

Participate Consider volunteering to help us execute the event. We need people for many tasks, food preparation, Hospitality, discussion. Ask your High School Children to Attend even if only a few meetings. Adults consider participating in Advent. This is for everyone and not just people who are new to the faith. Just call the office and Fr. Paul or myself will call you back.

GOSPEL FOR 24TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (SEPTEMBER 11TH)

LUKE 15:1-10

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them he addressed this parable. "What man among you having a hundred sheep and losing one of them would not leave the ninety-nine in the desert and go after the lost one until he finds it? And when he does find it, he sets it on his shoulders with great joy and, upon his arrival home, he calls together his friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.' I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance. "Or what woman having ten coins and losing one would not light a lamp and sweep the house, searching carefully until she finds it? And when she does find it, she calls together her friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found the coin that I lost.' In just the same way, I tell you, there will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

The family consists of a mother with 4 children under the age of six from the Democratic Republic of Congo. They had to flee the Congo and have been living in a refugee camp in Uganda. We are still trying to find them a place to live in the East Bay, so if you have any suggestions, please let us know. Most of all, we need cash donations to cover their cost of their first three months of rent and other needs.
