BLESSINGS FROM THE FRIARS ON RETREAT

The New Year is a time for review of the year past and the hope for the future.

The year past was a lovely experience of God's Mercy. It has been a year and a half since the Franciscans began ministry at Our Lady of Grace. The warm welcome marked the first year and I explored with you devotion to our patroness Our Lady of Grace. I introduced to you the Franciscan devotion to Mary and our connection to Our Lady of Grace through the Mission Immaculata began by St. Maximilian Kolbe. The image of Our Lady of Grace is a central part of the devotion by the wearing of the Miraculous Metal and consecrating oneself to the Mission of Mary to bear Christ to the world. This is a Mission of evangelization to pray for the conversion of every heart to bring them through Mary to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

We embraced the Year of Mercy with a pilgrimage to Italy and Rome to enter the doors of Mercy to pray for our loved ones and ourselves. We walked where Saints and Martyr's walked gave witness to there faith and transformed and empire and the world. That Mercy and Grace is available for us today to transform our lives and our world giving us hope through transforming love. When we returned we continued to ponder the Mercy of God through the play on the life of St. Faustina. We celebrated 24 hours of Mercy in prayer during Lent last year. We built community through school Breakfasts and a Community Picnic. We invited the youth to join me on pilgrimage to encounter St. Junipero Serra at the Carmel Mission. In November, we journeyed to Christ Our Light Cathedral in Oakland to walk through the Holy Door as we concluded the Year of Mercy.

In the Fall we embraced the New Evangelization through a program called Alpha as we opened our Youth to discuss the questions of life. In Advent I opened the program to the whole parish and I ask that you consider coming. Our Youth gather on Sunday evenings beginning January 8 and for everyone on **January 12**. There will be kid Kare for children on January 12. This New Year is an invitation to come encounter the Love of God at Our Lady of Grace.

John 1:29-34
