



The Raising of Lazarus

In the Gospel for the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we encounter what many consider to be Jesus' greatest miracle during his life – the raising of Lazarus four days after his burial. It is in this final Gospel from the scrutinies that we see the end result of our soul searching with the Samaritan woman and gift of sight with the man born blind. It is the promise of rising into new life with Christ.

The Basic Premise for the Scrutinies

Sin and evil are real. They are part of our lives. Their power is strong.

Salvation is also real. Christ's power to save, protect, and strengthen us is stronger.

Sin is only recognized in the light of grace. God's grace is always first.

The three scrutinies ritually celebrate the central mystery of life, death, and resurrection in the lives of the elect. It is the paschal mystery. The faithful see the power of God acting in them by participating in the rites, see the power of God at work, and decide once again to turn from sin and be faithful to the Gospel.

Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday) April 8

According to the main document on the celebration of the feasts connected with Easter, [Paschales Solemnitatis](#): Holy Week begins on "Passion (or Palm) Sunday" which joins the foretelling of Christ's regal triumph and the proclamation of the passion. The connection between both aspects of the Paschal Mystery should be shown and explained in the celebration and catechesis of this day.

What does Hosanna mean? (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI)

Originally this was a word of urgent supplication, meaning something like: Come to our aid! The priests would repeat it in a monotone on the seventh day of the Feast of Tabernacles, while processing seven times around the altar of sacrifice, as an urgent prayer for rain.

But as the Feast of Tabernacles gradually changed from a feast of petition into one of praise, so too the cry for help turned more and more into a shout of jubilation.

By the time of Jesus, the word had also acquired Messianic overtones. In the Hosanna acclamation, then, we find an expression of the complex emotions of the pilgrims accompanying Jesus and of his disciples: joyful praise of God at the moment of the processional entry, hope that the hour of the Messiah had arrived, and at the same time a prayer that the Davidic kingship and hence God's kingship over Israel would be reestablished.


