
Through the Blessed Virgin, Maximilian encountered the Lord Jesus and in Him the living Water of eternal Life (cf. Jn 4:14), which has to be shared with everyone. At the foot of the Cross, Mary was the first one to welcome Jesus' thirst, the thirst of the Crucified Love to quench the thirst of our hearts, and Maximilian wanted the *MI Militia Immaculata* to be a docile and generous instrument in Our Lady's hands for the fulfilling of this dream: the happiness of all people in God.

It is during the Annunciation (celebrated **Saturday, March 25**) that the plan God and promise of Jesus is proclaimed with a invitation given to Mary to bear God. Her "Yes" changed human history and hope was given to every human being.

Miracles of love are possible, according to the experience of St. Maximilian, when we rely on the intercession and mediation of the Immaculate. In an article from 1924 he states: "Rekindle love and trust in Mary Immaculate everywhere and you shall soon see tears flowing from the eyes of the most hardened sinners. You shall see prisons emptied, the ranks of honest workers increased; while home hearths will be redolent of virtue; peace and happiness will destroy discord and pain, for it will be already a new era" (SK 1069).

REPORT OF PROPERTY IMPROVEMENTS IN 2016

Our parish has one revenue stream and that is your contributions. During the last year the money you entrusted to us in the monthly Maintenance envelope for property improvements was spent in 2016 for the following projects: new carpet and flooring at the entrance to the parish office \$8,450; replaced the two furnaces in the parish office \$7,239.; outdoor lighting replaced for improved lighting and efficiency \$6,100.; Stack Center partition doors repaired \$2,500.; trees trimmed at the entrance on San Miguel \$2,400; front of Church was cleaned and painted \$2,100.; Parish office interior painted in the reception area \$1,580. Total property improvements and repairs came to \$30,369. The amount received thru the Maintenance envelopes last year was \$20,677. We encourage you to contribute using the monthly Maintenance envelopes for the upkeep of our Parish property.

A more complete reporting of the financial results of 2016 will be presented next week. Our expenses exceeded our revenue for the year.

Gospel for The Fourth Sunday of Lent (March 26th)

John 9:1-41

As Jesus passed by he saw a man blind from birth. He spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes, and said to him, "Go wash in the Pool of Siloam" — which means Sent —. So he went and washed, and came back able to see. His neighbors and those who had seen him earlier as a beggar said, "Isn't this the one who used to sit and beg?" Some said, "It is, " but others said, "No, he just looks like him." He said, "I am." They brought the one who was once blind to the Pharisees. Now Jesus had made clay and opened his eyes on a sabbath. So then the Pharisees also asked him how he was able to see. He said to them, "He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see." So some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, because he does not keep the sabbath." But others said, "How can a sinful man do such signs?" And there was a division among them. So they said to the blind man again, "What do you have to say about him, since he opened your eyes?" He said, "He is a prophet." They answered and said to him, "You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?" Then they threw him out. When Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, he found him and said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" He answered and said, "Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he." He said, "I do believe, Lord," and he worshiped him.

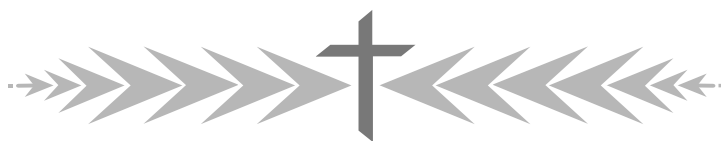
