## Entering into Holy Week

 $\begin{bmatrix} 1 & 1 & 1 \\ 1 & 1 & 1 \end{bmatrix}$  I invite you to set aside time to spend with Jesus this week. Make a plan this week to enter into prayer to prepare yourself to meet the Resurrected Jesus. Jesus in the garden of From the Pastor Gethsemane invites his disciples to pray while he is praying to follow the will of the Father. "Thy will be done" just as Jesus taught his disciples to pray. Join us in prayer this

week. Seek to spend time reading the Passion in one of the Gospels. This year we listen to the Passion in Matthew on Passion or "Palm" Sunday. On Good Friday we always read the Gospel of John. Join our Blessed Mother as she follows Jesus to the Cross where her heart is pierced by a sword as Simeon predicted. Pray the Sorrowful mysteries of the Rosary as a family each night this week. Pray and fast and abstain from meat on Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Iesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

#### Paschal Triduum

Make a plan as a family to join into prayer as much as possible to all the liturgical events of the Trid*uum.* The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum – from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil. The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are:

- Mass of the Lord's Supper
- Good Friday of the Lord's Passion
- Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord

#### Good Friday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

#### Join us on Easter Sunday to Celebrate the Resurrection and be touched by the love of the Risen Lord and bring that love Joyfully to a broken world.

Pope Francis said at Easter, we leave ourselves behind and encounter others by "being close to those crushed by life's troubles, sharing with the needy, standing at the side of the sick, elderly and the outcast." We are being missioned as Easter People. We find peace in Jesus' love for us and now we share it with others. We find ourselves standing side by side with Jesus, looking together at those we are being sent to love. That is where the real joy of Easter waits for us. Bring your family friends and neighbors to share the Joy!

#### Mercy Sunday

Join us on Mercy Sunday for an hour of Adoration, praying the Divine Mercy and confession at 3 PM on Sunday, April 23. After our prayer we will have a video presentation on the Divine Mercy Image given to Saint Faustina in Stack Center.


