Come Home for Christmas

St. Francis wanted all to remember the profound gift of Christmas. In December of 1223, Francis went to Greccio where he was inspired to recreate that special night in Bethlehem when Jesus was born. People had forgotten the humility, poverty, and love of that night in Bethlehem and wanted all to enter into the special gift of God with us. He prepared a cave with animals and invited the towns people to come to mass in that cave made into a stable. It was in that cave they celebrated the Mass. As we come to the Nativity Scene in the church or in our homes may we remember that night when the world received God incarnate, Jesus. When we look at the baby Jesus we see the image of God in which we were created.

Bring your Family, Friends, and Neighbors to celebrate the Feast of Feasts as St. Francis referred to Christmas. At Christmas God came to be with us because he loved us and Jesus will bring us back to our Father, our creator.

Paul Eugene Quante, O.S.A.** After several years of ill health and a debilitated use of his legs, Fr. Paul was found dead in his room at St. Augustine's monastery on December 9, 2017. At a time when the Christian church is preparing to welcome the Savior, Fr. Paul is being welcomed into Heaven. This is the reward for which he lived his entire life. A Mass for Fr. Paul was celebrated at St. Augustine Chapel in San Diego on December 14th. He will be buried in his family plot in Pennsylvania. Please remember in your prayers Fr. Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Advent (December 24th)

Luke 1:26-38

The angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. And coming to her, he said, "Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you." But she was greatly troubled at what was said and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." But Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I have no relations with a man?" And the angel said to her in reply, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. And behold, Elizabeth, your relative, has also conceived a son in her old age, and this is the sixth month for her who was called barren; for nothing will be impossible for God." Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

CONSECRATION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Prayer of Consecration

“Most Holy Trinity: Our Father in heaven, who chose Mary as the fairest of your daughters; Holy Spirit, who chose Mary as your spouse; God the Son, who chose Mary as your mother; in union with Mary, we adore your majesty and acknowledge your supreme, eternal dominion and authority.

Most Holy Trinity, we put the United States of American, and particularly, the State of California, into the hands of Mary Immaculate in order that she may present the country and our State to You. Through her we wish to thank you for the great resources of this land and for the freedom, which has been its heritage. Through the intercession of Mary, have mercy on the Catholic Church in America. Grant us peace. Have mercy on our president and on all the officers of our government. Grant us a fruitful economy born of justice and charity. Have mercy on the capital and on industry and labor. Protect the family life of the nation. Guard the innocence of our children. Grant the precious gift of many religious vocations. Through the intercession of our Mother, have mercy on the sick, the poor, the tempted, sinners – on all who are in need.

Mary, Immaculate Virgin, our Mother, Patroness of our land, we praise you and honor you and give our country and ourselves to your Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart. O Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary, pierced by the sword of sorrow prophesized by Simeon, save us from degeneration, disaster and war. Protect us from all harm. O Advocate, pray for us, that acting always according to your will and the Will of your Divine Son, we may live and die pleasing to God. Amen.”



“The Glorious Mysteries


The Coronation--Revelations 12:1-6





