Pray For The Pope and The Amazon Synod

Pray and Fast for the Amazon Synod in Rome from October 6th-27th “pray daily at least one decade of the Holy Rosary and to fast once a week” for these intentions until October 26th. We are asked to pray daily and fast on Wednesdays and Fridays asking the Holy Spirit to guide the Pope and the Synod.

Pray for the following intentions. Intentions that Pope Francis may “confirm his brethren in the faith by an unambiguous rejection of the errors” in the text.

1. Intention against any apostasy and heresy in the working document that it may be rejected.
2. That holiness and apostolic tradition regarding the Priesthood and Sacraments may be preserved.
3. A rejection of the working documents implicit pantheistic views, the *Instrumentum Laboris* relativizes Christian anthropology, which recognizes the human person as made in the image of God and therefore the pinnacle of material creation. It replaces this traditional view of humanity and considers the human a mere link in nature’s ecological chain, viewing socioeconomic development as an aggression to ‘Mother Earth’.
4. That the uniqueness of the individual created in the image and likeness of God is not replaced with “a tribal collectivism that undermines personal uniqueness and freedom,” May this be examined and errors rejected.



EUCCHARISTIC MIRACLE

In the city of Braine, during the twelfth century, Agnes of Braine, a devout Catholic countess, set out to bring to faith some non-Catholics who lived in the city. She was especially eager to convert a Jewish girl of great beauty who was adamant against belief in the sacred presence of the Eucharist. Agnes employed the young woman as a chambermaid/lady in waiting. In 1153 a solemn high mass in honor of the Holy Spirit was scheduled by the Archbishop of Soissons who included a procession around the city which fascinated even the non-Catholics. The Mass was crowded with believers and non-believers. At the moment of the Elevation, *(the people saw, instead of the Host, a small child.) No further detailed accounts are available but many non-Catholics who saw the miracle were so shaken and moved by its glory that they demanded Baptism. It is believed that the Jewish lady in waiting was among them. The miraculous host was visited and worshiped in a monastery founded by Countess Agnes for more than 550 years. In 1733, the host had finally decomposed in a natural manner but had survived the French Revolution.






FLOWER REMEMBRANCE FUND
