



Little Sisters of the Poor

The persecution of the Little Sisters of the Poor continues by our Attorney General the Xavier Becerra. It was not enough to get a Supreme Court Ruling in their favor and an Religious Exemption signed by the President. On October 24th, the 9th Circuit Court ruled against the Little Sisters of the Poor and the Religious Exemption given them. This means these nuns must either go against Catholic teaching and pay for contraceptives and abortions for their employees in their health insurance or stop offering hospice and healthcare to the poor which they have done in California for decades.


Mark Rienzi, senior counsel at Becket and lead attorney for the Little Sisters, previously told LifeNews: “Sadly, Josh Shapiro and [California Attorney General] Xavier Becerra think attacking nuns is a way to score political points. These men may think their campaign donors want them to sue nuns, but our guess is most taxpayers disagree. No one needs nuns in order to get contraceptives, and no one needs these guys reigniting the last administration’s divisive and unnecessary culture war.”

Last Sunday, I spoke about our First Reading from Maccabees which told of a family executed for not eating pork against their Jewish religious dietary laws. They chose to die rather than offend God. Sometimes people of faith have to say “enough is enough”. We will not deny our faith to capitulate to earthly leaders. May we pray for and support these Sisters who are taking on the power of the State which rejects the law of God and promotes murder of defenseless babies, coercing religious people to reject the teachings of their faith and to follow the teachings of the state. Jesus is the light of the world. May we follow Him with all our heart, mind and soul.

Jesus lets us followers know that there will be much persecution of believers. Persecution of the church continues around of the world. We remember the horrors of ISIS as it destroyed churches, killed those who would not leave or convert to Islam. Young Christian girls are being sold off as wives and children are being crucified. While the caliphate has been destroyed, the ideology of the professed continues. Even in our society, which is free and guarantees us freedom of religion, there are ideologies which continue to marginalize people of faith. To claim what Jesus taught is now considered to be offensive, bigoted and illegal, as Jesus has said that God created them male and female and the two become one flesh, that God joins and no man must divide. To say nowadays that there are two genders and marriage is between a man and a woman is considered offensive and illegal in our country, yet that is what Jesus taught. A man in Texas has to fight his ex-wife to keep her from allowing their seven-year-old son to undergo chemical transition to permanently sterilize him to become a girl. We must know our faith and what Jesus taught and then proclaim it until the end, for it is life. No one is a mistake and we are all children of God. Next weekend is Christ the King! Will we testify to our Faith saying “Vivo Christo Rey”? When the persecution comes, will we secure our lives by persevering in the faith?

Luke 23:35-43

You don't want to miss the OLG Crab Feed scheduled for **February 1st, 2020** in Stack Center, hosted by the Knights of Columbus.




HELPING HANDS MINISTRY
