



Join Us For Our Franciscan Dinner On November 9th

Come meet the future hope of the Franciscans as our novices come to join us for our dinner. Fr. Victor Abegg OFM Conv., our Provincial, will join us and share our situation and hope for the future. Many of our Franciscans will join in. We will have prayer, music, and a delicious dinner as we share our Franciscan history, presence, and vision.

We meet on November 9th, the Feast of St. John Lateran, which is the Church that the Pope speaks of as the Bishop of Rome. This was the leading church of the Pope until St. Peter's Basilica was constructed. St. Francis went to the Church of St. John Lateran to meet with Pope Honorius III to get approval of the Franciscan community and our rule of life to live the Gospel. The Pope first rejected the request of these poor fools until he had a dream and saw the walls of the St. Lateran Church collapsing and he saw the poor St. Francis holding up the walls keeping the walls from collapsing. In 1209, the Pope called St. Francis back and gave a verbal approval of the Franciscan way of life giving birth to the Franciscans. Living the Gospel is our gift and message for the Church.

The Franciscans are mendicants which means we are dependent on your generosity for our existence. We are beggars. Since the province of St. Joseph Cupertino began in 1981, we have begged for our survival. We have never had a surplus of money and have struggled to form and educate our young men and recently struggled to cover our healthcare expenses and now retirement expenses are threatening our survival. We are told that we are underfunded by 90% for retirement needs. Without your help we will no longer be able to bring men to become Franciscans and then serve you and your families. Even in our poverty we have committed our young friars to Missionary work in Vietnam, Bolivia, and Uganda. We support a Mission in Vietnam which is expanding beyond our every expectation. Working with lepers, ministering at abandoned rural churches, feeding persecuted minorities, feeding the sick, educating the young, and visiting the elderly are all part of our missionary work. None of this is possible without you.

Prayer For The Church

The final document of the Amazon Synod has been published and is now in the hands of Pope Francis. The document has proposed some things that are changes from practice and tradition of the Roman Catholic Church that go back almost to the foundation. May we pray that the Holy Spirit may guide Pope Francis as he reflects on and decides what to implement from the Amazon Synod.

My concern as your Pastor is to give you the practices and teaching that will allow you to come to Jesus to find Salvation and Eternal Life. The Scripture reveals His life and Message. When practices and ideologies contradict the Tradition and Scripture which are essential in the deposit of faith and which is the Truth and light that reveals Jesus so we can find Salvation, then I have concerns. I will try as your pastor to bring as much clarity as I can to give to you the deposit of the faith, so you may know our Faith in Jesus and find Salvation. Grace is given through the Sacraments to give each of us what we need for Salvation.

Our Blessed Mother at Fatima in 1917 revealed to us that errors would come to the world through Russia. 1917 was the birth of communism and the beginning of an ideology that has led to the persecution and death to over 100 million people in the world. Her message reveals great tribulation in the world and persecution of the Church. Mary gave us tools to respond through praying the Rosary, Consecration to her Immaculate Heart, and living a life of Grace with prayer, Penance, and sacrifice. Her message is hopeful that our practice of the faith, Consecration to her Immaculate Heart, and sacrificial Penance for others can change the future from violence, confusion, and endless war to Clarity of the Truth of the faith and True Peace in the Kingdom of God. Please come pray the Rosary 30 minutes before our Sunday Liturgies! Her Immaculate Heart will triumph.

Gospel for the Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (November 10th)

Luke 20:27-38

Some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us, *If someone's brother dies leaving a wife but no child, his brother must take the wife and raise up descendants for his brother.* Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman but died childless. Then the second and the third married her, and likewise all the seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be? For all seven had been married to her." Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord, 'the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive.'"

OLG WELCOMES INTERFAITH COUNCIL

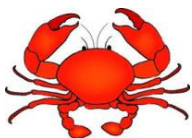


PRE-BAPTISM CLASS
