40 Days for Life

Take the challenge this Lent to save a life. The leading cause of death in our world is abortion. 42 million babies were aborted last year. Could you give an hour a week to end this holocaust and offer love to girls and women in crisis in our community.

My personal reasons are many. One my Grandma Rose went to Washington DC on one of the first March for Life. Second workers at a Catholic Hospital encouraged my mother to abort my little brother who is my Godchild. Third, I have mourned with friend who had abortions. Fourth, I have ministered to women who were healing after abortion who suffered greatly and found the Forgiveness and Mercy of God. Fifth, I took part of Project Gabriel at All Saints helping young pregnant women with practical issues of life so they could have there child.

I have been at the “A” Street Planned Parenthood in Hayward for at least 10 hours since Ash Wednesday. Could you join me? Could you take a day to be a day Captain? Could you commit to pray? Could you fast a day during the week for our 40 Days for Life Campaign? Could you share with someone the value of each human life?

Friday Stations of the Cross, a Franciscan Prayer

The Franciscan tradition Stations of the Cross were part of the Lenten devotional soon after St. Francis’ return from the Holy Land in 1221. The Franciscans became active in the development of the devotion of the Stations of the Cross when they were granted custody of the sacred sites of Jerusalem in 1343. Then they began to promote the devotion of Christ’s passion. During the 15th and 16th centuries the Franciscans began to build a series of outdoor shrines in Europe to duplicate their counterparts in the Holy Land.

In 1686, in answer to their petition, Pope Innocent XI granted to the Franciscans the right to erect stations *within* their churches. In 1731, Pope Clement XII extended to all churches the right to have the stations, provided that a Franciscan father erected them, with the consent of the local bishop. One friar, St. Leonard of Port Maurice, expressed his zeal by erecting 571 sets of stations between 1731 and 1751, becoming known as the “preacher of the way of the cross.” It is likely he was also responsible for reversing the order of the stations so that they ended at Calvary. At the same time the number was fixed at fourteen.

Come to Calvary with Jesus and Walk the Stations of the Cross every Friday of Lent. Join us at 2:30pm with the School, 6:00pm in English, and 7:00pm in Spanish.

The 2020 Bishop's Appeal is under way! There are 5 specific areas that receive funds from the Appeal:

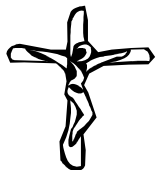

HEALTH PRECAUTIONS

During this cold/flu/virus season, we will discontinue offering the Precious Blood during Holy Communion. In lieu of offering our hands to others at the Sign of Peace, we will acknowledge each other with a slight head bow. Likewise, during the Our Father, we will refrain from holding hands. We thank you for your understanding.

All of us must be aware of such sensitive matters in the intimate life of the Christian community & we should be aware that by refraining from the Sign of Peace and the communal chalice is out of care for our well-being and not out of unkindness or lack of piety.

REGULATIONS FOR LENT

Abstinence and Fasting:

Abstinence from eating meat is to be observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays during Lent. This applies to all persons 14 and older. The law of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday applies to all persons 18 or older and younger than 59.

Fasting means that one full meatless meal per day may be eaten. Two other meatless meals may be taken sufficient to maintain strength, but together they should not equal a full meal. Liquids, including milk and fruit juice, may be taken between meals. If health or ability to work is affected, fasting does not oblige. Private, self-imposed observance of fasting on Lenten weekdays is strongly recommended. Parents should ensure that children who are not bound by the laws of fast and abstinence are taught an authentic sense of penance, conversion and reconciliation.

Lenten Observance:

Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass and in the Sacrament of Penance during Lent, and parishes are encouraged to provide regular and frequent opportunities for such participation. Likewise encouraged are devotions such as Stations of the Cross, vigils and prayer services (with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, if opportune). Traditional practices - including increased prayer, Scripture and spiritual reading, alms, personal self-denial in food and drink, increased care and service to the sick and needy - are also suggested.

Easter Duty:

All initiated Catholics are bound by the obligations of receiving Communion at least once a year and to confess sacramentally all serious sins not previously acknowledged in individual Confession. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter duty season, which is from the first Sunday of Lent until Trinity Sunday.
