

■■■■■ The Year of Mercy Begins

With the opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica on **December 8**, Pope Francis From the Pastor ushered in the Holy Jubilee Year of Mercy, with millions of faithful eagerly awaiting this moment.

Pope Francis celebrated Mass at St. Peter's Square on the 50th Anniversary of the Conclusion of the Second Vatican Council. Following Mass, Pope Francis opened the Holy Door and passed through it. Pope Francis wants the Holy Year to be "for all believers a true moment of encounter with the mercy of God." The Holy Door symbolizes your access to God to receive forgiveness and mercy. It's an opportunity to receive a Plenary Indulgence and experience the graces that come with pilgrimage to Rome during a Holy Year. During this journey of spiritual conversion, pilgrims will seek to be filled with God's love so they can experience His love and mercy in their daily lives. The Holy Door will be opened at the Cathedral of Christ the Light on December 13 in Oakland. You may go through the Holy Door in our Diocese.

Mass with Anointing

Join us on Saturday, **December 19** as we offer Anointing of the sick during our morning Mass. If you are elderly, have a serious sickness you will be invited to be anointed for healing of body and soul. Please state your illness before you are anointed. You will be asked to fill out a card so we can record this sacrament.

Consecration of Families to the Immaculate Mary

I invite families to consecrate themselves to the immaculate Virgin Mary on the Feast of the Holy Family at the 9AM and 11AM Masses on **December 27**. Why Consecrate? In a world full of violence, terrorism and evil to destroy our minds and life, consecration is a way of focusing us on an act of love. By joining Mary in our human response to say yes to bear Jesus Christ and His Merciful love to the world. We also ask her intercession for protection from all evil and know that Our Mother watches us her children, the children of God. St. John Paul II had his moto for his pontificate, Totus Tuus, Totally Yours.

The Militia Immaculata

In St. Maximilian's "system," one consecrates oneself to Mary by joining the Militia Immaculata to help in the conversion of souls through the intercession of Our Lady. In joining a Confraternity, your prayers and intentions are explicitly shared by others (hence the more "corporate nature" of St. Maximilian's way of Total Consecration as contrasted with that of St. Louis de Montfort). You will also be the recipient of mailings, magazines, etc., intended to deepen your resolve and assist you in trusting Mary. To do this, three steps are necessary:

- resolve to offer yourself as an oblation to the Blessed Virgin and to act as an instrument of her holy hands in bringing souls to her Son;
- enroll in the Militia Immaculata:
- piously wear the Miraculous Medal.

After you've decided to consecrate yourself and become a member of the Militia Immaculata, choose a Feast Day on which to have your name enrolled to the M.I. at Marytown.

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY FAUSTINA: MESSENGER OF DIVINE MERCY JANUARY 31, 2016


