Novena To Saint Anthony For Any Need (June 4th-12th) (Feast Day-June 13th)

St. Anthony, you are glorious for your miracles and for the condescension of Jesus who came as a little child to lie in your arms. Obtain for me from His bounty the grace which I ardently desire. You were so compassionate toward sinners, do not regard my unworthiness. Let the glory of God be magnified by you in connection with the particular request that I earnestly present to you. As a pledge of my gratitude, I promise to live more faithfully in accordance with the teachings of the Church, and to be devoted to the service of the poor whom you loved and still love so greatly. Bless this resolution of mine that I may be faithful to it until death.

- St. Anthony, whom the Infant Jesus loved and honored so much, pray for me. Amen.

An Explanation Of The Novena To Saint Anthony For Any Need

Saint Anthony received an apparition of the Christ Child, who, lying in the saint's arms, kissed him and told Saint Anthony that He loved him for his preaching. (Saint Anthony was renowned for his zealous preaching of the True Faith against heretics.) In this prayer, we recognize that our greatest need is for grace—the life of God in our souls—which saves us from sin. Our particular need—our request to Saint Anthony—is secondary. This prayer, however, does not shy away from asking Saint Anthony to intervene in a miraculous fashion to fulfill our particular need. In return for the good that we desire, we promise to live our lives as Saint Anthony did—conforming our actions to the truths taught to us by the Church, and serving the poor.

Most Holy Trinity Sunday

Today we celebrate the Trinity. This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next Sunday, however, are designated as solemnities, special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity—one God in three persons.

First Communions Begin On Corpus Christi Next Sunday, June 14th

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the whole Christian life. The feast of Corpus Christi is a celebration of Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist. It parallels the celebration on Holy Thursday in commemoration of the institution of this sacrament. When the Eucharist is carried through the streets in solemn procession, the Christian people give public witness of their faith and devotion toward the sacrament of the Eucharist.

The Sacrament of the Eucharist is a sign and cause of the unity of Christ's Mystical Body, because it stirs up an active "ecclesial" spirit in those who are more fervent in their Eucharistic devotion. Eucharistic adoration cannot be detached from the liturgical and communal celebration of the sacrament or from the commitment to the poor and to justice. One draws strength and justification from the other. We will begin to have First Communion at our Drive-In Mass at 9AM on Sunday June 14, 2020. Join us in your car or at our Facebook livestream Mass and pray for our Children that the Lord will bless our Children and Community!

Working To Bring Back Our Communal Worship

We need God during these troubled times. I remember when John Paul II went to Poland after his election as Pope and over a million people chanted "We want God!" as they confronted their government that discriminated against and punished people of Faith. I hear that chant again in the hearts of the faithful as they call to have our Mass and worship reinstated as essential. We have begun with our Drive-In Mass. We will work next to have an Outdoor Mass without cars. Finally, we will begin to have Masses in our Church. I plan to give options for those who have health concerns due to the Coronavirus, so people can participate at the level they can, safely. We will have safety as our primary consideration in whatever we do. We will continue with touchless distribution of the Eucharist at the gathering space entrance to the Church at 11AM and 1PM while the Sunday obligation is dispensed.
