Gospel for The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (January 24th)

Mark 1:14-20

To date with upgraded electrical to the area in addition to the canopies and Chapel structure and building costs, as well as the statues, lighting and heaters we have expensed \$15,060 for the outdoor worship space that has offered a beautiful and reverent space to gather as community during the ongoing Shelter in Place directives.


