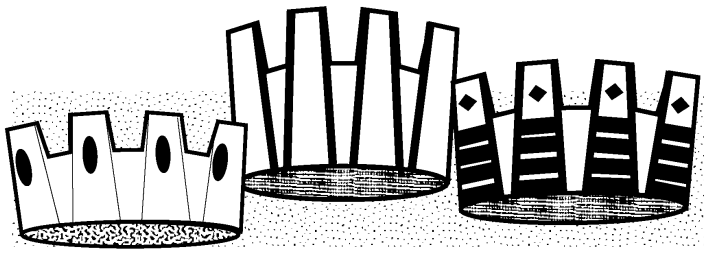

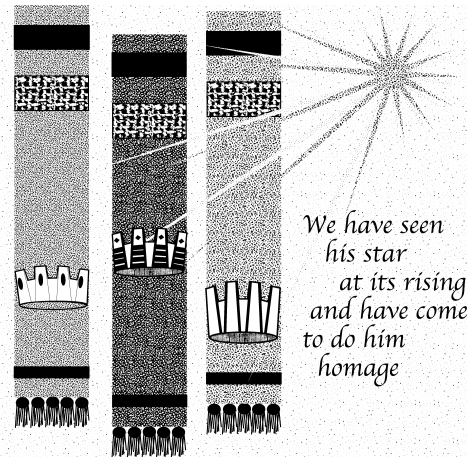
**WALK FOR LIFE WEST COAST 2022**
