

Last Sunday's readings made me reflect on the enormous Good that I see being done by our Parish. We do the Good that we do, as a sign of the Kingdom of God. A sign of Hope for others who may have lost Hope. I see a very active St. Vincent de Paul Society here at OLG who do much for people in our own Community who have fallen on hard times. There is a faithful group who go out every Sunday in our area to feed and clothe the poor. It is not an easy or desirable task to be doing this ministry. In recent days, the area was extremely wet and mud filled. Over time, they have gained the trust of those they care for and also try to get them into better and dryer conditions. In living their Faith, they have also become social workers. They are signs of Hope.

Knowing what I know and seeing what I see, I am reminded of the years I worked in the Missions. In Honduras, people suffered from a lack of education, lack of any health care, unpurified water, homes made of scraps (metal, plastic) and severe economic poverty. In Vietnam, people live much better as long as they can work and work hard. But for those who cannot work, hopefully they have a family who can care for them. Thank God for the Religious Communities like mine, the Conventual Franciscans, who care for the poor. Religious Communities are expected, and you might say tolerated because they care for the lost, like those with leprosy and the orphans. In practicing the Corporal Works of Mercy, the forgotten are given Hope.

OLG, keep up your practice of the Corporal Works of Mercy. Continue to be a Sign of the Kingdom of God and of Hope. Thank God we have members of our Community who can dedicate themselves to this Ministry. Not all of us can do this but we all can pray for this Ministry and be as supportive of it as we can.

## The Gospel for The Seventh Sunday In Ordinary Time (February 19th)

**Matthew 5:38-48** 

Jesus said to his disciples: "You have heard that it was said, An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth. But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil. When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow. "You have heard that it was said, You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect."






