

I hope your celebration of Easter and Holy Week was as grace-filled as mine. This is a great Season [[] [] [] of Easter in our Church. This Season lasts 50 days, 10 more days than Lent. The mystery of Christ From the Pastor life, death and Resurrection of Christ are central to our Faith. In light of this Truth, every Sunday is called a "Little Easter".

Have you ever been asked, "What do you Catholics believe?" How do you answer? Do you feel like you will have to explain all the dogmas, teachings, sacraments, and the Bible to that person? You could quote "The Creed", either the Nicene Creed or the Apostles Creed. But do you, yourself understand them? I want to suggest to you that the easiest, if not the best explanation of our Catholic Faith can be found in repeating to the Kerygma of our Faith. Kerygma is a term that is largely unfamiliar to most Catholics. Kerygma (from the Greek keryssein, to proclaim, and keryx, herald) refers to the initial and essential proclamation of the gospel message. The word appears nine times in the New Testament: once in Matthew (12:41), once in Mark (16:20), once in Luke (11:32), and six times in the letters of St. Paul (Rom. 16:25; 1 Cor. 1:21, 2:4, 15:14; 2 Tim. 4:17; and Titus 1:3). To put it simply, the kerygma is the very heart of the Gospel, the core message of the Christian faith that all believers are called to proclaim.

As strange as this might sound, you already know in your heart and by heart our Kerygma. You proclaim it almost every time you are at Mass. After the Consecration, the priest will intone or say: "Let us proclaim the mystery of our Faith". Often, we respond with the Kerygma, "Christ has died, Christ is Risen, Christ will come again". If someone asks about Catholic belief, proudly proclaim the Truth of the Gospel, found throughout the history of the Church, our Kerygma.

The Fourth Sunday of Easter (April 30th)

John 10:1-10

Jesus said: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber. But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers." Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them. So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."

Internal Food Manager: Operational oversight of internal food booths, manage supply inventory & POC for any external vendors participating


Entertainment Coordinator: Stage entertainment POC, manages internal & external partners, day of event area manager






