

Last weekend, Our Lady of Grace was at the Cathedral for Confirmation with our Bishop. We had 17 [] [] [] young people receive the Sacrament. They had been preparing for two years through prayer, instruction, and service. As a parish, we owe a debt of gratitude to Matt and Leeanne Thomas for their dedication in preparing them for Confirmation. Matt is a Scripture Scholar who teaches at the Dominican School of Theology. Thank you both and thank you to the many others who served as catechists and helpers in this

program. OLG, please be grateful and proud of this Blessed Program. This program is a work of OLG's hands.

Recently, I attended a meeting for the clergy of the Diocese. At that meeting we were told of the Chapter 11 Bankruptcy Protection filing. Everyone finds this to be very unfortunate and uncomfortable but necessary given the reality of lawsuits. There are stages involved in bankruptcy that have begun. During these first few months the Judge and lawyers will be making motions and the Judge will be making rulings. I am not an expert on bankruptcy, so I cannot tell you more. The clergy were told that all parishes will function normally. Everything is in the hands of the Bankruptcy Court and our Judge. We have already sent to you, through our weekly Flocknote, a communication concerning common questions and answers. Please read it and you will know as much as I know.

But there are a few important facts I want to call to your attention:

- 1) The Diocese of Oakland is two legal corporations: a) The Diocese and all the parishes and b) the Catholic Schools. It is the corporation of the Diocese and Parishes that is being sued. To be clear: The Catholic Schools are not involved in the bankruptcy.
- 2) All parish restricted funds, Bishop Appeal, Sunday plate collections will not be affected by the Bankruptcy filing.
- 3) Later, the Bankruptcy Court will determine what sources of funds may be exposed to the settlements, e.g. Diocesan insurance, unutilized properties, and unrestricted funds.
- 4) I want to clearly call to your attention, once again, the ongoing Bishop's Appeal. This is an example of funds that may NOT be touched. So, please support Appeal. By the way OLG, you're doing great in your support. Thank you!!

A word of caution. News can be biased. Newspapers, TV news and the internet are where we get much of our news but is it true or fake news? Not everything on the internet, in the papers and on TV is an unbiased approach. Please realize this as reporters are writing or speaking about happenings in the Catholic Church. What bias are they leading you to?

A portion of our clergy meeting concerned the Mission Alignment Program. MAP was initiated two years ago to mitigate a dire financial need of the Diocese. Since that time, however, the finances were addressed, thanks to improvements in the stock market and our nation's economy.

Due to the imminent retirement of Fr. Mario, the long and beloved Pastor of Transfiguration, a decision was made by the Bishop to cluster Our Lady of Grace and Transfiguration Parishes. About a week ago, Fr. Victor, our Provincial, was called by the Bishop and asked if the Conventual Franciscans would take on the Pastoral responsibilities for Transfiguration, in addition to Our Lady of Grace. Fr. Mario will retire as of August 31st and the Friars will assume the Pastoral responsibilities beginning September 1st. In a cluster, two parishes remain separate and retain their names but share one or more priests and one administration.

The Provincial will need time to consult with his Definitors at their monthly meetings. When it happens, this will only be the beginning of the discussion. Let's pray for the movement of the Holy Spirit to lead and direct all these decisions.

I do know this, ministry at both parishes will continue. Most of you will not even notice a change. As with bankruptcy, now is the time to wait and see. The Church will continue. Mass will be celebrated and Sacraments will be received. It will be on the organizational level where things in time will change. But isn't that life? Life is never static.




PRE-BAPTISM CLASS FOR PARENTS & GODPARENTS
