CLERGY APPOINTMENTS BY BISHOP MICHAEL C. BARBER, S.J. JULY 17, 2023

Bishop Michael C. Barber, SJ has appointed Fr. Raphael Zwolenkiewicz, OFM Conv. as pastor of Our Lady of Grace Parish in Castro Valley, effective August 1, 2023 and as pastor of Transfiguration Parish, also in Castro Valley, effective September 1, 2023, the date on which the new diocesan cluster of those two parishes is established.

The appointments follow the nomination by Very Rev. Victor Abegg, OFM Conv, Minister Provincial of the Province of St. Joseph of Cupertino of the Conventual Franciscan Friars.

A Letter From Fr. James


In 2013, one of the parishioners, a keen fisherman, who lived along the bank of Hong River Delta in Thai Binh province, was older than I was, came from time to time to tell me that he heard that the fish were biting in a local lake or creek. He assured me that, as soon as the weather pick up, he would be down there and catch a fish for me. His eyes were alight with joy just with the thought of it, and his joy was contagious.

His enthusiasm puts me in mind of the two people mentioned in today's parables — the man who found the *treasure* and the one who came across the precious *pearl*. They, too, came alive with joy. Jesus commented that the experience of God's Kingdom can generate a response like that. Do we know what he was talking about? Do we sometimes feel like that?

In 2017, I went back to Vietnam from the Philippines for a visit of a religious sister Thuy, joined Daughters of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary in Bui Chu-FMSR (*Filiarum Mariae a Sacrosancto Rosario de Bui Chu*), who worked with Franciscan friars in leprosarium at Van Mon, before she entered eternal glory; her doctors told her that her situation was terminal. I asked her if she was frightened of dying. She looked at me, somewhat puzzled, and gently corrected me: "Frightened of falling into the arms of God!" she whispered. Since she died, I delight that she felt so comfortable surrendering all she had and was and, even a little impatiently, looking forward to dropping into the arms of the God she loved. I am disappointed that I did not ask her to tell me what her experience of God had been.

I wonder if Jesus at times is saddened that so many of us Catholics have not yet discovered the beauty of a personal relationship with him, that not enough of us have felt, at least from time to time, the indescribable joy of real closeness to him and to God, his Father. Our Church can appear so dull, so stern, so stiff, so serious. No wonder so few seem attracted, and so many are just hanging on by the skin of their teeth.


The Transfiguration of the Lord (August 6th)




