


Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Serve the Lord with all Your Heart!




WORLD MISSION SUNDAY & CATHOLIC HOME MISSIONS APPEAL "Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move"


This Weekend-October 21st & 22nd




