My Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On Christmas Eve 1223, in the small village of Greccio, Italy, Saint Francis gathered at midnight with his friars and townsfolk in a mountaintop cave to reenact the scene of Jesus' birth. As he chanted the Christmas Gospel, Saint Francis became so deeply moved by the humility of

God-become-Man that the Christ Child miraculously appeared to him on the hay, and Greccio was transformed into a "New Bethlehem."

As part of the celebration of the 800th Anniversary of the creation of the Nativity Scene at Greccio, the Franciscan Family asked Pope Francis for the approval of a plenary indulgence in order to promote the spiritual renewal of the faithful and increase the life of grace.

It is a great gift and privilege that the Holy Father has granted this request, the approval of a plenary indulgence, on the occasion of the 800th anniversary of Christmas in Greccio.


This year, Catholics will be able to receive a plenary indulgence from December 8th, The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, to February 2nd, 2024, The Feast of the Presentation in the Temple of Our Lord Jesus Christ, by praying before the Nativity Scene either here at Our Lady of Grace Church or at Transfiguration Church or before the Nativity Scene in any Franciscan Church.

The usual conditions are required to receive a plenary indulgence (Sacramental confession, Holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Pope). Sacramental confession and receiving the Eucharist can happen up to about 20 days before or after praying before a Nativity Scene in a Franciscan Church. It is appropriate that Communion and the prayer for our Holy Father take place on the same day. One Sacramental confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences. However, for each plenary indulgence one wishes to receive, a separate reception of the Eucharist and a separate prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father are required. Those who are sick or unable to participate physically can obtain the indulgence by offering their sufferings up to the Lord or by "carrying out practices of piety."

It is a great gift and privilege that the Holy Father has granted. Here and in all churches entrusted to Franciscans for pastoral care, it is possible for all the faithful to receive a plenary indulgence from December 8th,

2023 to February 2nd, 2024.

#### Third Sunday of Advent (December 17th)

John 1:6-8, 19-28

A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. And this is the testimony of John. When the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to him to ask him, "Who are you?" He admitted and did not deny it, but admitted, "I am not the Christ." So they asked him, "What are you then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." So they said to him, "Who are you, so we can give an answer to those who sent us? What do you have to say for yourself?" He said: "I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord," as Isaiah the prophet said." Some Pharisees were also sent. They asked him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ or Elijah or the Prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." This happened in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.
