

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The Solemnity of the Epiphany, which we celebrated this past Sunday, celebrates the ways Christ has made Himself known to the world. The first of these events is The Visit of the Magi. The next two that celebrate the Manifestation of the Lord are the Baptism of the Lord and the Wedding Feast in Cana.

The Baptism of the Lord commemorates the Baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist in the waters of the River Jordan. With the Celebration of the Wedding Feast of Cana, Jesus begins his public ministry that culminates with His suffering, death and resurrection, and ascension into heaven where He is seated on the throne in glory.

This week I invite us to reflect on our own journey of faith and how Christ is made manifest. For some of us, we came in contact with the Lord in the Sacrament of Baptism in our infancy and for others when we were teens or adults. Through water and the Holy Spirit, we have become members of the household of God. And so, it is so important for us to come before the Lord often as we have done celebrating the Birth of the Lord, kneeling before the manger. We come before Him in personal prayer and when we are present at the Table of the Lord for the Celebration of the Mass. We come to Church as the Magi came to visit the Lord.

Then, receiving the Word of God in Scripture and receiving His Body and Blood in the Eucharist, we return to our homes transformed. Having the Lord within us, we give witness to His Life in the manner that we live our lives in our homes and wherever the Lord leads us.

And finally, as the Lord entered into His public ministry at the Wedding Feast at Cana, we need to participate more fully in the life of the Church. We are invited to participate in one or more of the ministries in our Church.

With the Celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, the Christmas Season is completed. In the Liturgical Year of the Church, we enter into Ordinary Time. Yet, in Jesus, nothing is ordinary. As Jesus was made manifest at The Visit of the Three Kings, at His Baptism and The Wedding Feast at Cana, we, as members of the household of God, in our daily lives, are invited to make the Lord manifest in our words and in our actions. It is an honor and a privilege to witness to the Lord always.

Mark 1:14-20

Then he called them. So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him.


### **ANNUAL SEMINARY COLLECTION**

### A CHRISTMAS MIRACLE!

A CHRISTMAS MIRACLE occurred on the grounds of Our Lady Of Grace Parish church in the final days of Advent 2023---the statue of our Blessed Mother, Mary, which has been enshrined for decades in the gathering area outside the church, was restored to its original beauty by parishioner Ron Emory and his daughter, Kristen. Decades of wear from the elements, cracks and deterioration due to the normal weathering of time, and past incidents of vandalism had battered the beloved statue that generations of OLG School students and parishioners had prayed to and adorned with flowers. Ron's final invoice technically describes the job as "detailed patching, sanding, priming and two coats of Permashield and Polyurethane," as well as cleaning up the statue's base and surrounding brick work. But technical details aside, it was artistry and craftsmanship that defined this restoration--Ron credits his daughter with a lot of the delicate detail work on Mary's face and tapered fingers. Mary's nose, for instance, had been busted and mashed at its tip and nostrils, the cracked and broken fingers had lost their definition (along with their fingernails). The restored statue is now defined by clean, graceful lines, with the entire form radiating the strength, beauty, and spiritual power of our Blessed Mother.
