Our focus is to honor the suffering of those who served and died. Our focus as a people of faith is the cross and Jesus Christ who in dying, rose from the dead. The Paschal Mystery is ever present.

And so, it makes remembering and honoring fallen soldiers more important as they remain alive in our collective civic memory. In celebrating Memorial Day, we can learn from the life of the Lord and the examples of the lives of so many who have served and died for our nation. Memorial Day honors all lives lost. By doing this, we recognize the value of each and every life and for peace to reign in our nation and throughout the world. With all the unrest throughout the world let us pray ... in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit .... That God's hand is at work to bring about harmony and peace among nations. This experience is so important today.

Once again, as we focus on our faith and celebrate Memorial Day, we look to our Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit to help us to understand more profoundly the sacrifice, love, and rebirth that the lives and deaths of those who have served embody.

To honor those who gave their lives for our country we must protect the freedom which gave meaning to their lives and which gives meaning to ours. In doing so, may God, Father, Son, and Spirit, be praised today, tomorrow and always.

#### The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (June 2nd)

Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

St. Vincent de Paul is grateful for the support of the Our Lady of Grace commu-

nity. We rely on your donations to continue this ministry. Please keep us in your prayers as we work to help our less fortunate neighbors. Here are a couple of examples of what your support allows us to do:

Terri lives in her car. She is currently enrolled in a truck driving course and hopes to find a job in long-haul trucking. This job would allow her to live in her truck and save money. We have been helping her for the past several months with gas and food cards. Please pray that she passes her test.

SVdP has been helping Lacey for the past 18 months. She had to leave her Teamster job due to a number of serious health issues. It took many months for the right doctors to sign off on her disability claims. By that time, she had run through all her money. She is currently living in a tent on the patio of a friend who lives in a trailer park. It is a dismal situation. We've given her a new tent, clothing and occasionally food and gas cards. We are praying that her application to Section 8 housing is accepted and that she finds a more humane place to live.




Registration forms are also available in the Parish Office. Please bring your payment of check or cash.
