My Brothers and Sisters in the Lord,

Having celebrated the Solemnity of Pentecost, we have praised the Most Holy Trinity two Sundays ago, and, this past Sunday, we celebrated The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, Corpus Christi. We have moved from the Easter Season. We are now in the Ordinary Season of the Church Year. This season is far from ordinary. The beginning of Ordinary Time marks the beginning of the Church's activity. In our day to day lives we are invited to give witness to Christ's life as His Life is being lived out in our lives. This week the Church celebrates the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This feast takes place on the Friday following The Solemnity of Corpus Christi, The Body and Blood of Christ. It was celebrated just a couple of days ago, June 7th.

With the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus being celebrated in the month of June, June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The earliest devotions to the Sacred Heart of Jesus can be traced back to the eleventh and twelfth centuries and is believed that Jesus chose Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1675, to share with the world His desire to bring new devotion to His Sacred Heart.

Jesus revealed to Margaret Mary twelve promises that He would bestow upon all those who practice the devotion. The Twelve Promises revealed by the Lord for those devoted to His Sacred Heart: I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life; I will establish peace in their families; I will console them in all their troubles; They shall find in My Heart an assured refuge during life and especially at the hour of their death; I will pour abundant blessings on all their undertakings; Sinners shall find in My Heart the source of an infinite ocean of mercy; Tepid souls shall become fervent; Fervent souls shall speedily rise to great perfection; I will bless the homes where an image of My Heart shall be exposed and honored; I will give to priests the power of touching the most hardened hearts; Those who propagate this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart, never to be effaced; the all-powerful love of My Heart will grant to all those who shall receive Communion on the First Friday of nine consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they shall not die under my displeasure, nor without receiving their Sacraments; My heart shall be their assured refuge at that last hour.



The Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time (June 16th)

Mark 4:26-34

Jesus said to the crowds: "This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come." He said, "To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.



Here are more examples of how your generous contributions are helping those in our community:

Nancy and her 3 children recently moved to Castro Valley from Hayward. Her roommate backed out days before they were to move, leaving Nancy to pay the entire deposit—money she did not have. She recently got a full-time job for a neighboring school district and earns extra money baby-sitting for a neighbor's disabled daughter on weekends. She also receives help from her ex-husband. SVdP was able to help her pay the balance of her deposit. The landlord has promised her a smaller unit across the street when he finishes updating it. This will reduce her monthly rent payment. Between the new job and lower rent, she feels that she will be fine going forward.

Some of the neighbors that we assist are just 1-time-get-through-a-disaster kinds of help. Others, especially those on SSI, need help more frequently to get through to the end of the month. Penelope is one of those. She is disabled and lives in 2nd floor apartment. We help her out with some food or a food card almost every month. Occasionally, we will help her with utilities. Our goal is for our neighbors to feel cared for and to help them keep a roof over their heads. Once someone is evicted, it is very difficult to get them back into housing.




