

Looking forward to celebrating Thanksgiving on Thursday, November 27th, let us keep in mind the good things that we have received throughout this past year and giving thanks is a time for us to pray for those who are less fortunate than ourselves.

As we gather at our family table, we must always keep in mind that which takes place in our Church everyday at The Table of the Lord—The Celebration of the Eucharist. Remember that the Eucharist is at the heart of everything. Here at our cluster, we would like to continue to give special attention to the Eucharist. To celebrate The Solemnity of Christ the King on November 23rd, there will be a Eucharistic Procession beginning with the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 2:30pm at Our Lady of Grace Church. As the Blessed Sacrament is carried throughout the procession, there will be Eucharistic Songs sung and Prayers offered. It is our prayer as well that all that will be taken place throughout the procession will proclaim our faith in Christ and direct our attention and the attention of others along the way to the Lord alone. The procession will have pauses along the way at which time a Blessing with the Blessed Sacrament will be given. Then, at the conclusion of our Eucharistic Procession at Transfiguration Church, Benediction with the Blessed Sacrament will be given. With this Blessing with the Blessed Sacrament, our Celebration will be complete. Everyone is invited to participate. Please be aware that arrangements need to be made to have transportation between our two churches.

Luke 23:35-43

St. Vincent de Paul will be collecting **coats** (men's, women's and children's - new and gently used) and **blankets**. As



In the same way, you should refrain from offering your hand to others at the sign of peace. Likewise, if you are not comfortable sharing the sign of peace or receiving the Blood of Christ from the communal chalice in fear of infection, you should feel no pressure to do so. All of us must be aware of such sensitive matters in the intimate life of the Christian community and we should expect that some will refrain from the sign of peace and communal chalice out of care for our well-being and not out of unkindness or lack of piety.
